<p>Don't forget to number your figures &amp; give them titles!</p> <p>FIGURE 1: <i>Beagle at rest</i> If you use an image you did not create, provide an attribution in the caption.</p>	<b>Let the organization of the poster tell a story</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Think of your poster as a story.</li><li>• The plot progresses from the left top of the poster to the right bottom.</li></ul>	<p>Don't use images just to take up space. Make sure they help tell the story of your project!</p> <p>FIGURE 3: <i>Beagle pre-bark</i> Use high resolution images when enlarging to avoid "pixelation."</p>
