Geography summer Work

Geography A-Level is divided into physical geography and human geography and you have a choice of task depending on which takes your interest. Choose from task A, B or C and submit to Kerry (kerry.thompson@wyke.ac.uk) or Cyril (cyril.clark@wyke.ac.uk) via email or bring with you to enrolment.

Task A

Changing Places

This is a topic that you will study after Christmas and looks at how places change through time and how those changes contribute to the character of the place.

We are interested in your place.

Research the area which you live and write a report on how changes have led to the character of this place. This can be on any scale you choose e.g. city, town, village, street etc. Please include both secondary and primary research.

Include the following:

- Location details
- History origins and how it has changed through time
- Description human and physical geography, building type, population characteristics, housing type, service and retail, recreation, infrastructure etc.
- What it means to you

Task B

Coastal landscape and systems

This is a topic that you will study after Christmas and looks at factors that effects the coastal landscape and changes to the coastal system

One change that effecting coastlines is sea level change.

Research global sea level change and produce a report.

Include the following:

- Evidence of sea level change
- Causes
- Effects at a range of scales local, national, global.

Note - Use case studies and examples to make this more manageable. Be specific and support with facts and figures. Consider where you get your information from.

Task C

Geography in the news

A successful geographer will have an awareness of what is currently going on in the world around them. Keep an eye on the news and summarise the geographical reports featured throughout the summer.

Tips

- -You could do this as a timeline separated into human, physical and environmental
- -Think about where the news stories are coming from. Is it a reliable source? Is it global news, is it ongoing?
- -Ensure that it is summarised in your own words but supported with key facts and information.
