Welcome to issue seven of our tutorial newsletter. We have lots of information for you this week on a wide variety of topics, whether your courses are continuing or not. It is our aim to help support and guide you as much as we can to enable you to be successful. For those of you whose courses have finished, we also want you to feel assisted in your next steps, whatever they may be.

Continuing Course Information :

We have now given sufficient opportunity for all second year and foundation year students to provide evidence to justify our providing the best possible grade to the awarding bodies. So, from next week, all vocational courses that will complete this year will no longer be setting work for students to complete, taking work in or providing RAG grades for engagement. Teams will continue to support students with work that may help them to prepare for their planned next step but there will be no compulsion for students to engage in this, nor will this be monitored.

There are a couple of important exceptional cases:

- Criminology year 1 – although this course is due to finish this year, in reality it is year 1 of a 2 year course. Given this, all criminology year 1 students will continue to receive set work on a weekly basis and RAG grades will be provided to monitor engagement until the end of the academic year.
- Foundation year BTEC courses – **These courses will now finish**, no more assessed work needs to be taken in after Friday 1st May and we will no longer provide RAG grades to monitor engagement. **However**, many of you will be wanting to progress to level 3 courses next year. If you are in this position, you will receive a letter explaining the conditions for your progression in the autumn.

The table below should give greater clarity on the courses that are continuing and those that are not. Of course, this is from a course perspective. Even if you are a student who is leaving this year, you are still a Wyke student until 31st August and all support continues to be in place.

Year	Course	Continuing (from Monday 4 th May 2020)
Year 2	A level year 2	No – Students should discuss any request for further work to support preparation for university courses / potential resits with their subject teams.
	BTEC year 2	No – No further mandatory work will be set or assessed and RAG ratings will now cease. Students to discuss with subject teams about support for any work they still wish to complete in preparation for university or moving into employment.
	Criminology year 2	No – No further mandatory work will be set or assessed and RAG ratings will now cease. Students should discuss any request for further work to support preparation for university courses / potential resits with the subject team.
Year 1	A level year 1	Yes – RAG ratings to continue (this includes Further maths. Students will receive estimated grades for AS Further maths)
	BTEC year 1 including Engineering	Yes – RAG ratings to continue
	Criminology year 1	Yes – students will start work for year 2 with tasks to be competed. RAG ratings to continue
	EPQ	No
	Core maths	No
Foundation Year	BTEC Firsts (Foundation year)	No – No further mandatory work will be set or assessed and RAG ratings will now cease. Students who wish to progress to level 3 courses at college will be set tasks to complete as part of their transition offer. Letters will be circulated shortly.
	GCSE	No

RAG grades due by 12pm Tuesday

All students on continuing courses will continue to receive a weekly RAG mark to represent the quality of their engagement with the remote working tasks they have been set. Teachers and tutors will be following up any concerns that they have and contacting parents where necessary. The grades essentially mean the following:

RED	No student engagement (this might not be your fault, but could be due to illness or IT issues. In this instance, please let your tutor know.)
AMBER	Some student engagement, but poor quality of work.
GREEN	Student is fully engaged and producing good quality work.



CyberFirst 2020 Announcement

Online Summer courses have launched!

The National Cyber Security Centre is delighted to announce that a new timetable of FREE CyberFirst student courses are available and applications for places will be via The Smallpeice Trust website.

In light of the serious impact of the global Coronavirus pandemic and the uncertainty of when social distancing measures will be relaxed, we have taken the pragmatic step of moving our CyberFirst summer courses online. We intend to maintain instructor led lessons which registered students will join daily, via a log in. Each course will run as half day sessions over 10 days where the content will be delivered by QA trainers in our usual fun and interesting way. All of these courses will continue to be certified by SQA and the NCSC.

To allow students from as many schools as possible to participate, we are offering FREE places to 14 to 17-year-old students to attend one of these online CyberFirst student courses.

To attend one of these virtual courses you will require access to a computer and an internet connection. Students will be sent information in advance to help confirm they have all that is required for the course.

Message from Paul Britton:

“I do hope you are all keeping well out there. Please let us know if you need help, we are all still working. For students finishing BTECs this year, we still don’t have clarity on the process for vocational qualifications. However, it is probable that all of our vocational courses we will be asked to complete a similar process to A levels and GCSEs with teachers providing estimated grades and rankings based on what they judge the students would have achieved if their courses had continued. These estimates will be based on all of the assignments that have already been submitted and also on what your teacher can reasonably predict you would have gone on to complete in terms of further units and resubmissions.

It is so sad to have to finish your courses in this way. However, keep discussing any other work that may be helpful with your subject teams and I am sure you will all get the excellent results you deserve. Please do get in touch if you have any questions.

For those continuing with their courses, well done to all of you who are successfully engaging with your remote learning tasks. The vast majority of you are engaging well and I couldn’t be more proud of the mature way in which you have responded to this situation. The tutorial team will follow up with those of you who are struggling to engage and we will try to help you get stuck in. Please do get in touch if you are struggling, your tutor is the best person to contact in the first instance.
