

Welcome to Wyke German – information for students who were absent from Wykestart

Hello Germanists! Hallo und Willkommen! Ich heie Heather Lorch und bin hier die Deutschlehrerin. I look forward to meeting you and hope you are as enthusiastic about the language and German culture as I am!! As you were absent from Wykestart, I have included the info we covered in class plus the activities we completed together, so that you are able to do the summer work successfully.

Below, you will find a **mini introduction** to the course specification, followed by the **Wykestart work** I would like you to work through at home on the topic: 'die digitale Welt.' It is a shame that we missed each other at Wykestart where we get to know each other a little, play some German games, learn about the A Level course and you get a flavour of my teaching style. Also Wykestart provides an opportunity for people to ask questions: if you have any, please drop me an email on heather.lorch@wyke.ac.uk and I will do my best to answer them. Following on from that, there is some **summer work** which you need to complete prior to the course commencing in September. We usually ask for it to be submitted during enrolment. This work helps you to make a smoother start to the course, demonstrates your commitment to study and helps us to determine whether the course is the right level for you. At the bottom of this document are some **optional extras** – if you are bored, stuck at home and want some variety, there are some recommendations of German films, TV programmes and music you may wish to access.

1. Mini course specification

2-year linear course (final exams in Yr 2) with internal AS-style exams/mocks in the spring/summer of Year 1.

Content of exams:

- **Paper 1 - Listening, Reading and Writing + Translation** (G to E and E to G)
 - based on all topics studied in Years 1 and 2
 - 2hrs 30 mins, 100 marks, worth 50% of A-Level
- **Paper 2 - Essay paper** – written in German
 - 2 x essays: 1 x book and 1 x film (approx. 300 words each)
 - 2 hours, 80 marks, 20% of A-Level
 - Film to be studied (start Autumn Yr 1) 'Goodbye Lenin'
 - Book to be studied (start in Yr 2) 'Andorra', by Max Frisch
- **Paper 3 – Speaking**
 - Detailed discussion of one topic card from all topics studied in Yrs 1 and 2
 - Presentation and discussion on Individual Research Project (IRP) of your choice
 - Max 16-18 mins, 60 marks, 30% of A-Level

Year 1 topic content:

- Familie im Wandel
- Die Digitale Welt
- Jugendkultur
- Feste und Traditionen
- Kunst und Architektur
- Das Berliner Kulturleben

Year 2 topic content:

- Einwanderung
- Integration
- Rassismus
- Deutschland und die Europische Union
- Die Politik und die Jugend
- Die Wiedervereinigung und ihre Folge



You will need:

- A5 journal/notebook for vocabulary
- A4 lever arch file (big and tall)
- A4 loose leaf lined paper
- Set of at least 10 dividers
- Highlighters

- Red/green pens (as well as black biros)



To do before term starts:

2 Wykestart work

Our topic is the digital world and I have prepared a selection of activities for you to work through, reinforcing vocab, grammar and some nice structures for speaking and writing. Please email me (heather.lorch@wyke.ac.uk) for a copy of these activities/ documents. It is vital that you work through it carefully – it looks as though there is quite a lot of work but much of it is short, quick tasks: they are not overly difficult but build slowly. You will need to use the language for part of the summer work (a written task) so take your time going through it. I have provided answers to activities at the end of the PowerPoints, to enable you to check your progress. **You do not need to print anything out.**

- Open the powerpoint '*Die Medien - immer etwas Positives*' as a slide show and read through the slides. As you progress, it starts removing words and you have to try to remember the missing vocab. No need to write anything down. It is purely a reading, vocab revision task with a word order activity at the end. 10 minutes.
- Open the PowerPoint '*neue Medien blue Wykestart*' and work through it orally and by reading it. It's about 2 men – one who is a technology lover and one who is a hater (and loves old-fashioned media). It is actually a very quick activity to work through. 10 minutes.
- Open the final PowerPoint '*Eine digitale Welt*'. This will take about an hour.
 - Slides 2 and 3. Normally we would play 2 games here, but they don't work unless you have a partner.... So just ensure you understand all of the vocab and then, just like the examples at the bottom of slide 3, try to make up 10-12 'Man kann....' Sentences using a structure from slide 2 and a verb from slide 3. Eg man kann die Nachrichten lesen.
 - Slide 4 – useful opinion phrases for part of summer work task b
 - Slides 5 & 6 Read the easy-peasy texts and do the 2 activities (answers on slide 15)
 - Slide 7 & 8 Same again (slightly harder texts – answers slide 16)
 - Slide 9 – normally a game of O's and X's with adjectives – check you know them all. Again, useful for summer work task b
 - Slide 10 – there are 8 errors –how many can you spot? Answers slide 16
 - Slide 11 – click on the YouTube link to the song and fill in the gaps. At the bottom do the R/F activity. Answers slide 17
 - Slide 12 Categorise the statements into Vorteile (pros) and Nachteile (cons). Answers slide 17.
 - Slides 13 and 14 are just nice structures to help with summer work below.

Although much of the above work was short, fairly easy reading, listening and comprehension work, the vocab will be useful for the summer work and for when we revisit this topic in year 1.

3 Summer work (please submit at enrolment)

- a) Grammar booklet. You need to work through the grammar booklet ('*Grammar booklet-summer work*'). The grammar points are well explained and should, by and large, be revision of GCSE grammar. Answers can be written on a piece of A4 paper – do not feel you have to print out the booklet. The asterisked pages (25-29 I believe) on cases are pretty difficult. Have a go but please don't worry if you cannot do them – this is really advanced stuff. You will be taught it all properly during year 1 of the A Level. This booklet may take you 1.5-2 hours.
- b) Writing. Prepare written answers to the following questions – I would expect 4-5 sentences per question. Use words, ideas and nice phrases you learned doing the Wykestart work above, but use the internet too to find ideas and new vocabulary which will make your answers more interesting.
1. Was kann man im Internet machen?
 2. Wozu benutzt du das Internet / dein Handy?
 3. Wie gefährlich ist das Internet? Was ist die negative Seite von dem Internet?
 4. Soll man Handys in der Schule verbieten? Warum (nicht)?
 5. Junge Leute spielen immer mit dem Handy, anstatt (instead of) Zeit mit Freunden und Familie zu verbringen. Richtig oder falsch? Warum?
- c) 2 mini translations on technology. To practise the vocab, structures covered in the above exercises, translate the 2 small texts on the document '*Summer 2022 translation activity*'.

It wouldn't hurt to review your GCSE notes and exercises, but the following will also be helpful (for anyone who wants a little more practice):

- Vlog your summer, create memes, write a song, poem or story – get creative!
